Breastfeeding Essentials is a **22hour** online course for frontline staff who are caring for families during pregnancy, birthing, and for the duration of breastfeeding.

Participants will learn how to apply each of the 10 Steps to Successful Breastfeeding, which can be related to the 7-Point Plan for the Protection, Promotion, and Support of Breastfeeding in community settings.

The curriculum is based on the 7 competency domains established in the Baby-friendly Hospital Initiative® (BFHI) implementation 2020 update.

Breastfeeding Essentials will meet your need for frontline staff education for your hospital or community Baby Friendly accreditation.

CURRICULUM

MODULE 1 Why breastfeed? [Step 2] (2 hrs)

What's the difference?; Human milk as nutrition; Macro-nutrients; Micro-nutrients; Immune factors; The case for breastfeeding; Acute illnesses of childhood; Non-communicable/Chronic diseases; Cognitive development; Maternal health; Economic and environmental health

MODULE 2 Protection of Breastfeeding [Domain 1, Step 1] (1 hr)

The Baby-friendly Hospital Initiative; International Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes; Infant Feeding Policy and Monitoring

MODULE 3 Communications [Domain 2] (2.5 hrs)

Communication skills; A time to learn; Non-verbal communication; Listening skills; Barriers to effective communication; Building confidence; Applying counseling skills

MODULE 4 Prenatal Education [Domain 3, Step 3] (1 hr)

Decision making; What is most influential?; What physical preparation should birthing parents do?; The power of words

MODULE 5 Birth [Domain 4, Step 4, Step 7] (2.5 hrs)

Birth and breastfeeding initiation; The first hours; Labour interventions; Postnatal interventions

MODULE 6 Breastfeeding the Infant [Domain 5, Step, 5, Step 6, Step 8] (5 hrs)

Breastfeeding the Infant; When should an infant be fed?; Positioning principles; Milk transfer; Assessing breastfeeding; Managing common difficulties; Nipple Pain; Breast problems; Insufficient milk supply; Expressing human milk

CURRICULUM (CONTINUED)

MODULE 7 Special needs and infant challenges [Domain 6, Step 5, Step 6, Step 9] (4 hrs)

Challenges; The 'late preterm' 'early term' baby; Hypoglycemia and Jaundice; The non-latching baby, Twins and multiples; Supplementation; Unit Activity; Feeding-line device at the breast or chest; Cup feeding; Finger feeding; Bottle feeding; Crying baby; Pacifiers/Dummies; Inadequate weight gain

MODULE 8 Maternal Challenges [Step 5] (2.5 hrs)

Medical, surgical issues (diabetes, obesity, thyroid disease, hepatitis, HIV, breast surgery); Postpartum mood disorders

MODULE 9 Transition to community [Domain 7, Step 10] (1.25 hrs)

Discharge preparation; Sourcing and developing resources; Community Referral Lists; Special Circumstances; Infant Feeding in Emergencies (IYCF-E); Acute Care After Hospital Discharge; Relactation and Induced Lactation; Beyond the first few days

MODULE 10 Wrap Up (0.25 hrs)

Closing session, extra resources, skills competencies, assessments, certificates









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
